- Fit smoke alarms on each level of your home and test the alarm is working on a weekly basis. Change the battery regularly (unless it's a ten-year alarm).
- Identify escape routes from each room and keep them clear.
- Ensure everyone can find keys for doors and windows. •
- Take extra care when cooking especially when tired or if you have been drinking.
- Do not smoke in bed. .
- Never leave a burning candle unattended.
- Do not overload electrical sockets one plug for each socket and unplug it if not being used.
- Close doors at night to slow down the progress of any fire that may break out. ٠

## Parish Council Update

The Huff Cap- Owners, John and Elizabeth Willmott and Operations Director, David Roffe attended the March Parish Council meeting to explain to residents why the pub has closed and also provide an opportunity for people to ask questions. They are currently considering three options which are: to sell the pub to a new operator, to find new lessees and finally, to find an alternative use for the site. Residents who attended the meeting made it very clear just how much the village of Great Alne value their local pub. Damaged Chevron - The damaged Chevron at Alne Cote Corner was reported to Warwickshire County Highways as soon as the damage occurred back in October 2018. Further damage has since occurred and been reported. County Highways have confirmed that this matter is in hand but the Chevron is a special-order item and therefore taking longer than usual to obtain

Spernal - Coughton Fields Lane, U route formerly known as E5998 - At the March Parish Council meeting, residents raised the ongoing issue of the anti-social behaviour taking place on the U route between Spernal Lane and Coughton Fields Lane. Alcester Police have advised residents to continue to log this on each occasion by calling 101. Whilst they appreciate it is not often possible to provide registration numbers, any information regarding where the bikes/ cars are coming from, description of vehicles/bikes/people etc. will all help in trying to resolve this issue. The Police have said they will try and do additional patrols and hope to put an appeal out on Social Media requesting information on this. The Parish Council are continuing to look at ways to prevent 4X4's and motorbikes entering the track. Further details can be found within the minutes of each meeting.

## May 2019 Elections

The Notice of Election for both Great Alne Parish Councillors and District Councillor are now displayed on the 3 noticeboards in the village. The elections are scheduled for 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019, but should no further candidates come forward for Great Alne, this will be classed as uncontested and a vote won't be required. Elections for District Councillor will still proceed.
