Beware of bogus traders

Bogus traders operating door-to-door will often take advantage of poor weather conditions to offer their services, including flooding and high winds, which may have caused damage to your property. Otherwise they may try and point out 'problems' that don't actually exist. Bogus traders can be extremely persuasive and elderly and vulnerable people are often targeted. They may suggest that the property, if not repaired, will be dangerous or may put a time restriction on the offer to hurry you into making a decision. The work will normally be done immediately, before the householder changes their mind, and very often any information provided by the workmen (names, addresses, telephone numbers) are false, making them very hard to trace. Here is some advice, provided by Warwickshire Police on how to protect yourself from bogus traders:

- don't be forced into making a quick decision on the doorstep •
- get at least three quotes from local reputable companies who have reputations to maintain, and if possible, seek recommendations
- only deal with firms with genuine verifiable telephone numbers and addresses beware of companies that only use mobile phone numbers and accommodation addresses
- anyone who signs a contract on the door step following a visit that was not arranged (unsolicited) does have 7 days in which to cancel it by law.
- all cancellation rights must be provided in writing to the customer at the time the contract is agreed, usually on the doorstep - it is an offence not to do so
- if you don't want to speak to the trader don't open your door to them it can be hard to distinguish the good traders from the cowboys so it might be easier to keep the door closed
- do not allow uninvited callers into your home
- refuse to be taken to the bank to withdraw money if you ever feel intimidated by them, close the door and call the police

UBUS

UBUS is now travelling to Redditch or Evesham on Wednesdays. On the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month, UBUS will travel to Redditch. On the 2nd and 4th Wednesday, it will travel to Evesham (including the Valley). Journeys will take place in the normal way with passengers being picked up from their home and then dropped at an agreed destination. Passengers will then be collected and returned home as usual. Travel to Stratford will still be available on Wednesdays via another UBUS service.

Prices range from £2.70-£3.40 for a single journey and £5.40-£6.80 for a return journey. If you are not yet a UBUS user, you will need to register in order to use this service. Please call 01789 26 44 91.

Salter's Oak Update

Works continue to progress well and to programme, with overall completion of the site still anticipated for July/August.

The final two local market homes for sale at Salter's Oak, plots 1 and 2 (four-bedroom detached homes with double garages), were released for sale on Saturday 9th March 2019. Plot 2 is presently the view home and has its own direct access from Spernal Lane whereas plot 1 is currently being constructed and is due to be completed summer 2019. Both plots are offered exclusively for 12 weeks to people with a local connection* to the Parish of Great Alne. If they remain unsold at the end of this period, they will then become available to the open (full) market on Saturday 1st June 2019.

Plots 3-8 are already sold or reserved and the first property handover took place on 22nd March. Plots 9 & 10, two 2-bedroom cottages with large gardens, are now available to the full market and viewing is highly recommended. Plot 2, the view home, is open by appointment, therefore if you would like to arrange a viewing please contact Peter Clarke New homes on 01789 852180. They will also be able to provide you with further information and details on local connection criteria as well as arranging to take you to view plots 9 & 10. It isn't currently possible to go inside plot 1 due to its stage of construction, however this will be possible shortly.

Great Alne & Kinwarton Memorial Hall

Although the Hall Trustees are willing to allow the gate to be used by the public to enter the garden from Appleby Close and cross the Hall frontage to access the Henley Road (and vice versa), they wish it to be known and recorded by the Parish Council that this is a Permissive Path and not a public right of way. As such they reserve the right to close the path at any time. A notice drawing attention to the fact that a Permissive Path has been created is attached to the gate.

Broadband Bid Update

We understand that many residents continue to be frustrated by poor broadband speeds. Good news may be ahead...

Stratford District Council (SDC) are committed to assisting in the provision of improved faster broadband connectivity for their communities and have made it one of their Corporate Strategy priorities. They have agreed to submit a BID for Government funding to the Local Full Fibre Network

Programme. This fund has allocated £95million for the UK and welcomes BIDS from Multi Authorities. SDC are intending to submit a BID for themselves and any Parish Council that wish to be included.

Great Alne have requested to be part of this BID and SDC hoped to complete the work on this by the end of March. We will continue to provide updates on this in the Parish Council meetings.
