## Top tips from Warwickshire Police this Christmas:

- Cars - Always lock doors and windows and consider use of a **steering lock**.
- Keep presents or shopping out of sight.
- Thieves look in glove compartments first for mobile phones and valuables, take them with you.
- Going on holiday? Leave lights and a radio on timer switches and ask a neighbour to go in and collect mail.
- Hall tables are the first place thieves look for valuables.
- Secure your shed with a bolt and padlock and consider fitting an alarm.

## Parish Council Update

### The Huff Cap

2019 has seen the very disappointing closure of the Huff Cap. At this time, the owners are exploring alternative uses for the site. We will keep residents updated as soon as we have further information. In the meantime, we appreciate residents are unhappy with the general state of repair of the grounds of the pub and we have contacted the owners to request they take action on this.

### Flooding

During the extreme wet weather over the last few weeks, there have been concerns over flooding/drainage in lots of different parts of the village. The Parish Council have been in contact with County Highways who confirmed the drains had been recently cleared and they are done so on a cyclical programme. County Highways did report problems with the drainage systems being simply overwhelmed due to the excessive rainfall and waterlogged ground conditions. County Cllr Rickhards suggested that the Parish Council request a comprehensive survey from the Flood Risk Management Team. The Chairman and Cllr Clark will review the village and compile a list of areas of concern before requesting the survey. Other Parish Councils have seen considerable improvements following this type of survey and necessary work so we hope it can be of benefit to Great Alne.

### Spernal - Coughton Fields Lane - U\_route

On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> November, a contractor put strategically placed large tree trunks at both ends and in the middle of the U\_route. The Parish Council are very hopeful that this will help to resolve the long-standing issues of anti-social behavior in this area. ### Street Lights

We are aware that several street lights within the village are not working. These have been logged with Warwickshire County Council. Due to the age of these lights, in most cases, new poles and lamps are required which is costly. The Parish Council have ring-fenced funds to pay for these and will continue to put money aside for these necessary replacements. Replacements are scheduled in for January 2020.

### Pavements

Ongoing concerns over the poor state of the pavements between the Memorial Hall and the Church have been raised with County Highways repeatedly and, whilst repairs are on their programme, delays continue. We have expressed our concerns clearly and County Highways confirmed that whilst there is very little they can do to improve the condition of the footway without a full scheme to address the surface, they have now put this as priority number 1 for the Stratford Area. The Parish Council will continue to chase this up and report back at each meeting.

### Alne Cote Corner

The Parish Council had requested that the 30mph speed sign be moved so that it sits at the Alcester side of Alne Cote Corner. Sadly, WCC Traffic and Safety have refused this request. Whilst they are happy to move the sign closer to the bend, they will not include the bend itself within the 30mph zone. The reasons are complex and it was agreed that the Parish Council should request clarification in writing – this will be provided at the January meeting. Traffic and Safety have offered to install an extra reflective chevron which the Parish Council have accepted.

## Salter's Oak Update

Following an 18 month build programme construction at Salter's Oak (Linfoot Oaks) is now complete. Since the last update the remaining three local market homes for sale have completed and been handed over to the new owners, plots 16 & 17 (the final two affordable homes to rent) have been handed over to Orbit Homes and Warwickshire Rural, and the new residents have moved in. All of the site hoarding was removed in August and the marketing sign board has recently been dismantled and removed so that the grass seeding to this area could be finished. The estate road and private access roads were tarmacked in early October giving a finished look to the whole area.

Landscaping work continues as certain aspects can only be carried out at certain times of the year. Bare root planting, including the hedge along Spernal Lane (in front of plots 13-17), the landscape buffer belt, the balancing pond area and the open spaces will be done over the winter months, whereas the seeding to these areas balancing pond area and buffer belt (and any topping up as required to the open spaces) will be carried out in the early Spring. The landscaping that has already been undertaken is developing well and as it starts to mature will encourage wildlife.

As most of the works have finished this will be the final Salter's Oak update and some of the residents have kindly provided some comments on how they have settled into their new homes (and for those who weren't already resident in Great Alne, into the community).

### Did you know that fibre broadband may be available to you already?

CSW Broadband have already completed upgrades to several parts of Great Alne.

### To find out if you can get fibre broadband:

1. Enter your landline number or address into the [BT Broadband Availability Checker](#).

If fibre is available, either 'VDSL Range A & B' or 'WBC FTTP' will be listed in the 'Featured Products' column of the results table along with the speeds you are likely to achieve.

2. Remember, that if fibre is available, **you will need to order the improved service** to benefit from it. Use a comparison site such as: [MoneySavingExpert.com](http://MoneySavingExpert.com), [Broadbandchoices](http://Broadbandchoices), [Broadband Genie](http://BroadbandGenie) or [Cable.co.uk](http://Cable.co.uk) to find / order a broadband package that meets your needs.
