Crime Report

While incidents of crime in Great Alne remain low, there have been an increasing number of reports regarding vehicle crime and anti-social behaviour on the roads in and around our parish.

In relation to the use of quad bikes and 4x4 vehicles on local U-routes and Eroads such as Stoat Lane, Alcester police have informed us that as far as they are concerned, these lanes are legally useable by motorists, with there being no speed restrictions listed. It is not acceptable for vehicles to be stopped, blocked or drivers harassed for legal usage. Any evidenced anti-social behaviour or traffic offences such as erratic driving or riding without helmets on motorcycles and no insurance can be reported and investigated through normal police reporting channels.

Stratford District Council Green Waste Initiative

From 1st April 2021, emptying of the green bin will only be carried out where residents have subscribed to the Garden Waste Service and are displaying a valid permit on their bin.

The registration cost is £40 per bin. Residents can subscribe to the service online

(www.stratford.gov.uk/gardenwaste) or by phoning 01789 260 628.

Residents can also request up to three food waste caddies which can be put out alongside the green bin and will be emptied at the same time.

There are notices on the village noticeboards regarding this initiative.

Parish Council Update

The Huff Cap

The new owners have recently submitted new plans to SDC: these are publicly available by visiting the 'Planning' page of the Parish Council website.

In brief, the proposals include the: "erection of 2 new dwellings, re-configuration of public house car park and beer garden including demolition of modern garage." The major change from the original plans being the erection of 2 dwellings rather than three.

Flooding

As we move into spring, it's fair to say that to a greater or lesser extent, most parts of the village experienced some flooding or drainage issues over the winter. While the Parish Council are still pushing for a comprehensive survey from WCC's Flood Risk Management Team, the Team came to the village in mid-January and jetted the drains along the bottom end of Spernal Lane. However, following a particularly heavy period of rain, the drains were quickly blocked up again from the amount of rainwater and soil running off the nearby fields. WCC's Highways Department have confirmed that they are planning to clear the system out again and potentially survey the drains with a camera to see if there are any issues along the system which they need to be aware of.

Litter picking weekend!

The Parish Council, in collaboration with the Great Alne and Kinwarton Memorial Hall, are organizing a 'Great Alne Family Litter Picking Weekend' on **Saturday 24th and Sunday 25th April 2021**. This will be a Covid-safe way of having some outdoor fun while helping to look after our lovely local environment.

There will be two 'Base Camps': i) outside the front of the Memorial Hall on Henley Road, and ii) outside Hill View, Burford Lane (which is next door to Burford Lane Farm). The Parish Council will provide litter pickers (disinfected between uses), refuse sacks and disposable gloves. We are also happy for you to return the sacks to the Base Camps for disposal. All we need is an hour or so of your time to help us pick up litter in any part of our parish. Please contact the Clerk to book your time slot for the litter pickers. There will be a small thank-you for each child who takes part (please note that all children must be accompanied by an adult for the litter picking). Further details and times will be posted on our Facebook page and website. Depending on the success of this initiative, we hope to establish this as a regular event for our village!

Recreation Park – New 'Playground Friends' Group

The recreation ground is likely to be increasingly utilized over the coming spring and summer as restrictions ease and the weather improves. It needs a spring clean and tidy up! The Parish Council is seeking volunteers to form a volunteer maintenance group, or local 'Playground Friends' group. Being part of this group would mean engaging twice a year with buckets, mops, sponges and brooms to help clean down the equipment and sweep up the twigs and branches in the toddler area.

Your help would make the playground a nicer area in which to play and keeps the equipment clean and safe for all our children.

Dog fouling

Following a number of recent complaints about the increase in dog fouling, the Parish Council contacted SDC for further guidance. Since October 2020, Great Alne falls under a Public Spaces Protection (Dog Fouling) Order, which sets out a number of penalties and fines that can be imposed if someone is caught allowing their dog to foul anywhere in our village and fails to pick it up. Not being aware of the fouling, or not having a receptacle to pick it up, is not an excuse under the Order.

Please be aware that only a police community support officer or person authorised by SDC, has the relevant authority to impose a fine. Please use judgment and caution if you decide to approach someone who has failed to pick up after their dog. The Parish Council has put up several new dog fouling signs around the village which highlight the potential fine. If anyone feels their street or a specific location could benefit from a new sign, please contact the Clerk as there are a few left.

A further deterrent which SDC suggest is working as an effective deterrent in some villages, is the use of temporary yellow line paint to spray a ring round the dog mess on the street. The Parish Council would like to hear from volunteers who would be interested in helping us with this initiative (with guidance of course!).

Great Alne Park Update

Ben Ling, Site Manager for Inspired Villages has provided the following update:

As the current Coronavirus restrictions are starting to ease we are looking forward to reopening the restaurant and welcome back the local community. Based on the current Government roadmap we are expecting to be open from week commencing 17th May. We will hopefully be able to hold some events in the amphitheatre this summer, with the performance of the Petticoat Council planned for June. This is the story of the first all-female-run council in Britain; a real-life group of housewives from a rural Warwickshire village who broke down barriers to transform their community. We think this will be a fantastic performance and will share further details once it is confirmed.
